Midterm Election Talking Points

Heading into the midterm elections, Republicans are in a strong position to take back the House and the Senate majorities. We are confident about 2022 – but we can't afford to get complacent. Here are some key points to keep in mind as you talk to voters.

Did you know that The National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) established the Caring for America program in 1999 to encourage state federations and clubs to actively participate in at least one community service program?

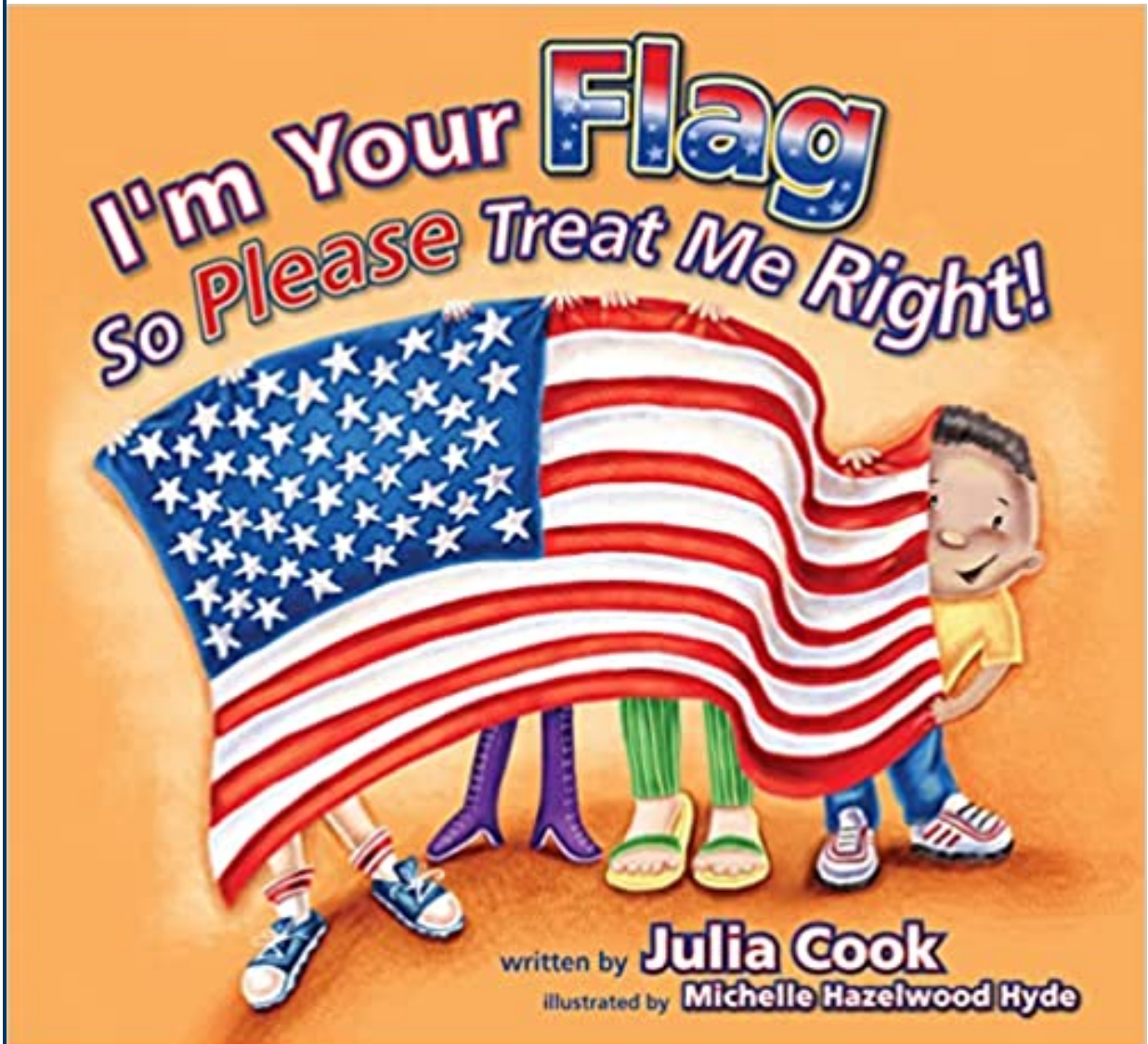
Caring for America is based on the belief that problems can be solved most effectively through the generosity and combined energies of individual citizens.
